




We are working toward transformed health systems to improve the well-being of individuals with complex health and social needs.



#### The Camden Coalition as a Regional Health Hub



The Camden Coalition was designated as a regional health hub in February of 2020. All regional health hubs are mandated to participate in the following activities:

- 1) operate a health information exchange
- 2) convene community stakeholders
- 3) serve state departments as a strategic planning partner

#### Activities include:

- plan and execute population-level health interventions
- perform quality improvement activities
- establish and implement social determinants of health screening protocols
- conduct care coordination
- provide reporting on health goals and needs of the region

# Community-based organizations utilizing the Camden Coalition HIE



- Volunteers of America (housing) to identify high-risk patients in their shelter for care coordination and to refer patients to quarantine hotels during COVID-19 pandemic
- Oaks Integrated Care (behavioral health) for ED notification alerts and piloting new transitions of care workflows
- Northgate II (medical and social care coordination) to respond to hospital visits and medical needs of their residents
- **Faith in Prevention** program encourages faith-based organizations to get alerted via the HIE when members of their FBO are admitted to the hospital for social support




# How do we determine governance structure for sharing data among medical and social service providers?



- All participating organizations of our HIE sign a Business Associates
  Agreement and HIE Participation agreement that explains organization's responsibility to uphold HIPAA and other policies
- HIE Oversight Committee's role
- Landscape analysis to understand success in other communities
- Piloting with smaller group of dedicated partners to tweak workflows and identify gaps and areas of improvement

Linking healthcare, behavioral health, and other sector data demonstrates the complexity of individuals in Camden who cycle through multiple systems.
